- 1^o Mary Palmer - William Barow & Elizabeth Barow were proposed for membership. These friends having been well known among us as consistent members of y^e church formerly under y^e pastoral care of the late Rev^c Thos^r Morrell of Wymondley - it was thought unwise to appoint messengers - but it was at y^e same time suggested that some account of their relig^e experience might tend to y^e advantage of y^e church & cause to themselves a warmer interest in y^e affections & prayers of y^e brethren -

- 3^o It was Resolved - that y^e collections at y^e Lord's Table shall in future be appropriated to y^e relief of y^e necessitous members of y^e church - & that y^e quarterly public collections be devoted to y^e incidental expences attendant on y^e maintenance of divine worship it being understood that any balance exist at y^e end of y^e year on y^e one account - it shall be regarded as available to meet any deficiency that may appear in y^e other

- 4^o Rebecca Hull - Sam^l Impy & Philip Lane all of whom had been proposed for membership prior to y^e resignation of the Rev^c Thos^r Griffin (former pastor of this ch^t) severally appeared before us & related their x^r experiences. Prayer Meet^r for y^e success of Am. Missions was introduced &
discussed — but there appear^r some differ^r. of opinion on y^e
subject it was referred for future consideration.

of which he stated to y^e church — when it was resolved

- ⁵⁰ Our br^r Thorn & Wilson stated that Mr. Wilshire Jun^r fully admitted y^r truth of y^r charges exhibited against him & professed his sincere repentance of y^r crime & that he also expressed his willingness to submit to y^r discipline of y^r church. — Under these circumstances it was agreed to restore him to our fellowship & that he be requested to attend our next meet^g when our pastor will communicate y^r decision of y^r church.

⁵¹ Whereas certain Regulations were framed (at date of purchase of land) for management of the Burial Ground adjoining the Meeting house near Telehouse St. Hinchin - which rules have at different periods been subject to revision - it has been thought desirable owing to & extreme difficulty there exists in the application of these enactments to the altered circumst. of the church & congregation - as well as on acc. of inadequacy of burial fees to meet the expenses incurred in the preservation of ground - that a new code of regulations should be framed.

In accordance with this opinion the following rules were this even^t submitted to the consideration of the church & adopted in.

I. - That the lineal descendants of all original subscribers for the purchase of ground to the amount of 10/- shall enjoy the privilege of interment in the same grave with their respective ancestors without any fee beyond the actual expense of open & closing the grave.

II. - That whereas under former regulations individuals were permitted to purchase family vaults or tombs for the sum of 10/- 10/- - That right of such purchases by sole & exclusive use of these receptacles for interment of their dead is hereby recognized. - But that no such claim can be admitted as valid unless a legal recd. for the purchase money is produced - nor ^{unless} such vaults or tomb shall have been formed - erected - or parcellled out previous to Decr. 1. 1841.

III. - That the following table of fees shall be rigidly adhered to with respect to all future interments - excepting the cases specified in the foregoing rules - & those members of the church who on acc. of poverty of their connection may (in the judgment of the minister & deacons) be entitled to gratious sepulture.

Note - That all y. actual expenses occasioned by interments in private graves - vaults or Tombs are to be defrayed by parties so interring.

IV. - That y. monies thus received be appropriated to defray y. expenses occur^c. by y. management & preservation of y. burial ground at y. discretion of y. Deacons & that y. amounts shall be annually submitted to y. church at their first meet^e: in y. month of January.

Our br^r Shadwell then implored y^e divine blessing upon the exercise of Chr^s discipline — that it might subserve y^e reclamation

- of y^e offender & increase y^e watchfulness of every member of y^e church.

And upon further Trust in case a separate School Room or School Rooms shall be erected or provided upon the said piece of ground or any part thereof as aforesaid or if there shall be no separate School room or School rooms and it shall by the Male Members of the said Society being communicants or the Major part of them at their Church Meeting duly assembled as aforesaid, be thought necessary or expedient to hold and teach a Sunday or other School or Schools in any proper part of the said Meeting house to permit and suffer a Sunday or other School or Schools to be held conducted and carried on from time to time in the said School Room or School Rooms, or if it shall be thought necessary or expedient as aforesaid in the said Meeting house, then only at such hours and times as shall not interfere with the Public Worship of Almighty God therein, and in all cases whether in the said Meeting house or not under such Government orders and regulations as shall be agreed upon by the Male Members of the said Society being communicants or the Major part of them at their Church Meeting duly assembled as aforesaid. And upon further trust to permit any part of the said Trust premises to be used as a place for interment in such manner as shall be directed by the Male Members of the said Society being communicants or the Major part of them at their

Church Meeting duly assembled as aforesaid And upon further Trust from time to time to raise such sum or sums of money as the Male Members of the said Society being communicants present at a Church Meeting duly assembled as aforesaid or the Major part of them shall direct by Mortgage or Mortgages of all or any part of the said Trust Estate, and make any conveyance demise or other assurance whatsoever for that purpose and to stand possessed of the money which shall from time to time be received on any such mortgage upon Trust for the liquidation of the debt now due on account of the said Trust property or such portion of the said debt, but in case the said Society or Congregation holding the Doctrines aforesaid shall be totally dissolved or dispersed and the Public Worship at the said Meeting house be discontinued by them for the space of 12 calender months together, Then Upon further Trust to let convey and release the said Meeting house hereditaments and premises with the appurtenances to such person or persons as the Managers for the time being of a Society called the Particular Baptist Fund Committee established in London in 1717 or the Major part of them shall from time to time direct or appoint of or concerning the same Provided also, and it is hereby agreed and declared that when and so often during the continuance of the Trust hereby created as the number of the Trustees of the said hereditaments and premises shall by death or otherwise be reduced to ten or less it shall be lawful for the male members of the said Society or the Major part of them assembled for that purpose in their Church meeting to choose nominate and appoint some other

fit and proper persons to be Trustees of the said hereditaments and premises in the place of the late Trustees thereof and upon every such choice the continuing Trustees or Trustee for the time being shall at the expense of the Trust Estate or of the funds of the said Society release and assure the said Meeting house hereditaments and premises with the opportunities so and in such manner as that the same may become legally and effectually vested in such new Trustees only or in such new Trustees jointly with any continuing Trustees or Trustee as the case may require upon such or the like Trusts and for such or the like intents and purposes as aforesaid before declared and expressed of and concerning the same premises.

It appearing however that the bushes in Back St. had taken no disciplinary notice of the alleged offence although Mrs. Weston had altogether withdrawn from their assemblies for more than 12 months prior to her application for membership with us - the church decided upon receiving her into our communion & a letter to the ch^t. at Back St. was adopted explaining the reasons for this decision.

council to be adopted under existing circumstances it was unadvised - That our pastor be requested to nominate other two members of the church who in his judgment may appear competent to sustain the Deacons' office.

Our pastor then submitted the question to the members regarding them to report the names of the two brethren who had secured the greater number of votes after our bro. Foster. Upon examining it was found that the choice had fallen on the brethren Thos. Dodwell of Uppley and Mr. Skillington & Thos. Wilson of Hinchin & that these b.^rs had been elected by a very large majority.

The b.^rs Jno. Foster & Thos. Dodwell (being present) then signified their acceptance of the call of the church - & Thursday evⁿ. May 31st was appointed as the time of their publick designation to office.

In making this entry which may possibly be read by generations
yet unborn, the present pastor cannot avoid supplementing the
account with the statement that in first exciting the people to attempt
the erection of a new Chapel he acted under a very painful consciousness
of duty, of that while in the course of the undertaking many great &
unanticipated difficulties were encountered, & hardly co-operation by
goodwill of congregation aided by the divine blessing
overcame them all. It is also especially deserving of notice,
that since the completion of the work, several of the most
wealthy & liberal of the contributors, have been removed by death,
without whose countenance of assistance it is not likely that
the church would have entertained the idea of erecting so
convenient & substantial an edifice. - How then can this
and more appropriately else, than in the language referred to
above? Or with the prayer of those of man of God "Let thy word"
"appear unto thy servants & thy glory unto their children." And
"be the beauty of the Lord our God be upon us, Establish thou"
"the work of our hands upon us, yea the work of our hands establish"

and spirits, hoping that my usual autumnal bout
might by the Divine blessing serve to recruit my
exhausted energies, & thus enable me to resume the
work of the Lord among you with fresh vigour & delight.
In this expectation I have been sorely disappointed,
The much spent in seeking augmented fitness for labour
has witnessed the complete prostration of the nervous
system, and compelled me to seek medical advice.
The opinion of Dr. Congdon's Doctor for your perusal.
The path of Duty seems thus far made clear, - I acting
under his impression & embrace the earliest opportunity
of laying the matter before you, for your prayerful
consideration, so far as I know my own heart I
have no wish in the slightest degree, to influence your
judgment, The prosperity of the cause of Christ amongst
you I can honestly affirm to have engrossed my warmest
solicitude my studies & my prayers. You may therefore
beloved friends rest assured of my perfect willingness
to concur in any arrangement for the future which
your collective wisdom may suggest, not shrinking
from the designation of the pastorate itself, should
such a course be deemed most conducive to the
welfare of the community. I seek not
yours but yours has been the actuating principle of
all my past labours in word & doctrine & I trust that
at this trying crisis of our social history I shall have
grace given me to adhere to it with unshaken resolve.
And now beloved brethren commanding the whole matter
to your very serious & prayerful attention I calmly
await the result. May the Wisdom that
cometh down from above richly pervade all your mind
& control all your deliberations, that so God in all

things may be glorified through Jesus Christ to whom
be glory and honor world without end, Amen!

Labours; beg to advise him to rest from the onerous
duties of the Pastorate for a season; during which the
Church will feel anxious, as far as possible, to promote
his personal comfort, and that of his Family, and
fervently pray, that he may be speedily restored to
his wonted health, and the work of the Ministry.
and that in the mean while, his soul may be kept
in perfect peace, and realize in an eminent degree,
the Divine presence, support, and communion.

Dearly beloved brethren, my joy and crown, grace be to you & peace from Jesus our exalted Head.

Ever since I left you, I have had it on my heart to write you a few lines in acknowledgement of the kind resolution passed at your last Church meeting, & forwarded to me the same evening by our beloved brother Shawell. Suffering as I still am, from a serious debility which renders any kind of mental application exceeding to try, & positively injurious, you must excuse both the tardiness & the brevity of this communication, & consequently leave it with our Heavenly Father to determine the proper season for the full utterance of my heart towards you. — Yet I cannot refrain from assuring you that the response given to my Letter to the Church, was every way worthy of you, & such as to render your impossibility still dearer to your Pastor's heart, while it served in no slight degree to relieve that deep dejection of spirit which a variety of trying circumstances and conjectured possibilities had been permitted to induce. — In this season of painful suspension from my much loved work, & of compulsory separation from a sphere of labour where the Lord has graciously vouchsafed many tokens of His compassionate regards, towards the unworthiest of all his servants, I find abundant opportunities for calmly reviewing the character of my ministrations. How & urgent calls for the exercise of penitential humiliation before God. — Enough has there been; it more than enough of sin & imperfection to render it a miracle of grace that any blessing has been granted, enough & more than enough to account
